



Statement of Summer Safety*

*Note: This is a general statement of intent based on current conditions and recommendations. Our detailed plans are currently being reviewed by local health officials and other professionals. Some details will change as we get closer to the camp season. Specifics for your program will be included in campers' info pack mailing mid-May.

Impact 2818 holds the safety of campers, volunteers, and guests as our top priority. For summer 2021, in light of the COVID-19 pandemic, we are responding in the following ways:

- 1) Pre-Camp Screening. Campers, Staff, and Volunteers will be required to monitor symptoms for 14 days before arriving to camp. Upon arrival everyone will be given a questionnaire and temperature check. Check-in will be a 2 hour window, drive-thru style, with requested arrival times based on last names. ***If anyone in a vehicle fails the health screening, everyone in the vehicle will be required to return home.***
- 2) Pods. Campers will be assigned pod groups for the duration of the event. In cabins, campers will follow a head to toe sleeping method to ensure 6 feet of distance.
- 3) Masks and Distancing. We ask all campers and volunteers bring at least one mask per day for their event. In the event that pods must be indoors together, distancing and mask policies will be in place.
- 4) Outside Mentality. Weather permitting, we will be outdoors! Be sure to check the weather and send your camper with bug spray, sunscreen, hat, sunglasses, and water bottles. If campers are inside, masks, distancing, and ventilation will be in place to keep your camper safe.
- 5) Disinfect. Our sites are ready with EPA approved cleaners to prepare and follow up all meal times, bathroom use, and activity materials with disinfectant.
- 6) In the event of a sick camper. If a camper becomes ill, will be immediately quarantined in our medic's office until parents/guardians can be contacted to pick them up. Next steps and contact tracing will begin immediately.
- 7) After camp. We will send information home with every camper on safe next steps for appropriate re-enter to the general public.
